### Our Mulligan Moment

It seems that last month has brought us a lesson in golf -course spirituality, since life on the links can keep our souls in balance and bring us closer to God. Terrie Burbank shared an article "What Golf and God have in Common" with us at adult Bible study last Sunday. It reminded me of my collection of books and articles on the subject. (Yes, there are a few – including my favorite, "Golf in the Kingdom").

While there is no way the experience of golf can be equated with a deeply spiritual, mystical experience there are some lessons for our spiritual lives to be learned from golf. Golf can be spiritually therapeutic, and as a game offers some significant insights into how God wants us to live.

Millions head for golf courses every day including Sunday. Apparently, they find golf to be more satisfying and intriguing than church. What's the draw here? Perhaps this weekly ritual is its own kind of "sanctuary." Golfers may be savoring a form of spiritual growth that they struggle to attain in the course of our standard Sunday service.

People persistently line up to shell out big dollars for the raging golf phenomenon because, quite frankly, it's good for their souls. Not great for their wallets ... or even their moods ... but for their souls. Golf is a game that pushes players to attain perfection in driving, pitching and putting -- a goal that is clearly unattainable for human beings. Even the greatest players in the world hit some ugly, awful, embarrassing and just plain bad shots. And frequently, even a really good shot can take an unfortunately bad bounce.

M. Scott Peck in his book about golf and spirituality teaches:

- Be attentive to the hazards ahead of you, but empty yourself of your fear of them.
- Strive to do your best, but empty yourself of your concern with your score.

- Learn from every mistake, but empty yourself of any shred of self-hatred for your imperfections.
- Compete, but empty yourself of shame that you are not measuring up.
- Play to win, but if you fail to do so, empty yourself of any remorse.
- \* Use your mulligan.
- \* Take an unplayable lie.
- Play one hole at a time.

These are tantalizing tips for the game of life, as well as for the game of golf. We are healthiest in spirit when we are as humbled by events of even a game.

Among all of the quirks and lessons of the game is the one that is not actually legal according to the rules—the "mulligan." Make a terrible shot and, among friends, you may have the opportunity get a "do-over" I tried looking up the origin of the term and it is unknown.

Nevertheless, we had thought that we had made an excellent shot with the shared pastor agreement – but it took a bad bounce.

Now we get our mulligan – our "do-over" -maybe even apply a few life lessons from golf. The Session will review demographic information about Corona to see if there is anything new. #### At our May meeting:






