#### Partor's Ponderings

Last May I shared about a statement from Laura Fishburn of Duke Divinity School that "if you want to know what Christians believe, study what they say and do in worship." Our worship should form us as community of people and prepare us for ministry in the world.

She wonders "in a world that is increasingly polarized and detached from moorings in faith and meaning, God might be calling the church to consider anew through worship to be witnesses in the world – a witness not just to the teachings of faith, but to the way of faith, engaging with others and offering to others an alternative to the dominant self serving profit-seeking narrative of the world and culture, helping others to find meaning and goodness."

She suggested ways we could do this and I think that we can say that "we do them pretty well."

We see and hear one another. While we haven't rearranged the chairs so that we face each, or sing a cappella so that we hear each other, we definitely get high marks for greeting each other and share expressing "we are so glad you are here."

We pray for each other and for the world.

Another recommendation is that congregations not try to make perfect worship services and be a little more free flowing. Within the bounds of the Presbyterian reformed order of worship that we follow, I think that Dr. Fishburn would approve of our willingness to laugh and to make space for forgiveness for errors and appreciate our family feeling.

We were not successful in making Food for Thought a community outreach of FPC Corona. Yet, the concept continues. The Corona senior center and Crossroads church have adopted the model. They have the resources and are continuing a program that the community needs.

We are continuing Thursday programming with "Movies with a Message." The proposed auto biography and portrait program is on hold until our leadership team receives more training and is ready to restart.

Dr. Richard Bane is unable to teach the Sunday morning study on the book of Jeremiah.

Instead, I will be leading a study on "What the New Testament says about women – and especially women in ministry." Each week we will look at a different portion of Scripture. If you have to miss a week, come back the next. I believe that you may be surprised by how central and positive the role of women was and, especially, how much the Apostle Paul supported, even depended, on women in ministry.

We may not be the largest congregation in Corona, but I believe we are one faithful and alive – and moving in the right direction.
