Sue Bain and Awu Ncha (and pianist Delia Martinez-Samojluk, too) are contributing financially in covering some of the church's ongoing needs. The Lord knows!

Last, but far from least, I want to "double-thank" the powerhouse, the Administrative Assistant who is also the Clerk of Session, Marilyn Mittlestadt. For years Marilyn has been the Silent Secret keeping the Corona church going. Also, there are many hours required in being a Clerk of Session. Only one of her duties is keeping the Minutes and ALL the Church Records as required in the PC(USA) Book of Order! Starting last month she has been preparing your documents for the annual Presbytery Audit! One of Marilyn's other Secrets is being a Right Hand to anyone who is filling the position of Pastor at Corona (including what is required as part of Session duties.) This is especially true when the Session Moderator is one assigned by the Presbytery's Pastoral Committee! I am talking about the efforts in preparing each month's Consent Agenda and Docket for the Session (not to mention, printing each Sunday's Bulletin as well).

Not on Session but separately, ignoring long-distance difficulties, Judy Hanson is the second Administration Assistant on Corona's staff. She has been superb in working with me each week in preparing the Bulletins, and in her efforts as the "Web Servant" – even when she is not feeling well. Thank you, Judy!!

So why am I expressing these thanks in the Newsletter? I thank them all, but I want you-all to be aware of your hard-working crew here at Corona. You are blessed by their dedication and efforts.

Who knows? I may be assigned as Moderator for Corona again? However, your long-time goal should be continuing to take the necessary steps to be able, once again, having a selected new Pastor...even if only part-time. You deserve it!

Meanwhile, my temporary position as Pulpit Supply Pastor, which we have been calling "Guest Pastor," has given me much joy as I have become acquainted with each and every one. As a Congregation – you are a gem!

Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA) and Hurricane Helene

"Hurricane Helene was the first Category 4 storm to hit Florida's Big Bend region since 1851. Many deaths, and loss of homes and cars has shattered lives.

The Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (<u>https://pda.pcusa.org</u>) is one of the Compassion, Peace and Justice Ministries of the Presbyterian Mission Agency.

PDA instantly mobilized emergency assistance to the communities and the Presbyterian churches affected. In this case, the National Response Team was sent to Western North Carolina.

The Presbytery of New Hope in the northeastern corner of the state reported a sinkhole and tornado damage in their area. A coordination meeting is scheduled for Friday Oc. 4th with Presbyterian representatives attending: Georgia. South Carolina and Presbytery of Western North Carolina.

In Rutherford County, North Carolina, water is "overtopping" Lake Lure Dam, which is southeast of our Presbyterian Montreat Conference Center. The Conference Center had some damage with repairs already started. Nearby churches are delivering foods to the lower lobby of Montreat's Assembly Inn. Rutherford Presbyterian Church is a secondary shelter housing some of the affected residents. (There is some flooding in the town of Montreat.)

Additionally, Rev. Dr. Holly Dillon, General Presbyter of the Presbytery of Tampa Bay, reported on the damage in that area. Along with the forced closings of churches are seminaries, including the Union Presbyterian Seminary.
